
Starting next month, Cablevision will begin eliminating the duplicate analog feed of the Broadcast Basic and Family tiers, creating a fully digital cable system in the Norwalk franchise area. The transition will be rolled out in the Norwalk franchise area beginning on June 1, 2010 and concluding by approximately June 15, 2010. Customers with a digital television with a QAM tuner or digital equipment with a CableCARD will continue to see the Broadcast Basic and Family tiers without any additional equipment. Customers with analog televisions will require a digital set top box to view any tier of service.

More than 90% of Cablevision video customers in Connecticut presently subscribe to the company's digital service. Digital cable television offers the benefits of improved picture and sound quality and has become the preferred transmission technology in the industry. Until now, we have also continued to carry duplicate analog feeds of the majority of the programming on the Broadcast Basic and Family tiers. Eliminating the last remaining duplicate analog channels and transitioning to a 100% digital service will permit Cablevision to continue its history of innovation and investment, allowing the company to offer more high-definition, video on demand and other enhancements to its industry leading Optimum products and services.

To make the digital transition easier for customers, Cablevision will extend various free digital cable box and CableCARD offers to customers and will take numerous measures to inform customers of the changes to their service. Customers will be notified of the digitization through on-air messages on the programming channel guide, by a separate mailing at least 30 days in advance of the changes, and by outbound telephone phone call. Customers will also be able to find their most current channel line-up and more details about the transition on our consumer website www.optimum.com. Customers will be offered multiple options for receiving the free set top boxes Cablevision makes available in connection with this transition.

Cablevision hereby files this letter to clarify its April 5, 2010 and April 27, 2010 notices regarding our planned elimination of analog service in the Bridgeport and Norwalk franchise areas. Following such planned elimination of analog service there will be no change in the digital Broadcast Basic and Family service. As you know, digital Family Cable is encrypted. Customers with a QAM tuner will continue to be able to view Broadcast Basic. Family Cable will continue to require a CableCard or set top box. Please note that our notifications to customers (see attachment) clearly articulated the equipment required to view the Broadcast Basic and Family tiers.
